Want to be a Precinct Leader?

What is a Precinct Leader (PL)?

As a Precinct Leader (also known as Precinct Captain or Precinct Committeeperson), you are the consistent presence representing the Democratic Party in your neighborhood. Elections are won or lost in precincts, and Precinct Leaders are critical for community engagement and ensuring strong Democratic support (votes!) for Party candidates and issues.



PLs are elected in the precinct for a four-year term and can also be appointed by the Chair.

What are the Qualifications for a Precinct Leader?

Any registered Democrat is eligible to be a PL in the precinct where they live. It helps if you are a strong communicator and a people person!

Why Should I be a Precinct Leader?

A PL serves as an enduring connection between the Party and the community

where they live. Their primary role is to represent their precinct within the Party and Get Out the Vote (GOTV).



What Are Some of the Responsibilities of a Precinct Leader?

- Get to know and build relationships with the Democrats in your precinct, Get Out the Vote (GOTV) and participate in voter registration and other Party activities.
- Attend monthly meetings as a voting member of the Palm Beach County Democratic Executive Committee (DEC).
- Participate in training.
 - Support nominees of the Democratic Party and educate voters.
 - Participate in fundraising efforts.

What is the Time Commitment?

The time commitment varies. Time spent increases as elections approach. A PL typically spends at least 5-10 hours a month on Democratic Party efforts.
